

The children from Year 5/6 had the most fantastic time away at PGL Bawdsey Manor, Suffolk. To celebrate the children reaching their House Point challenge of 25,000 in a year, the school paid for a number of inflatables to be available as a treat for the children. Through the careful risk assessment, strategic planning and the location of shade around the school, the inflatables were enjoyed safely by every child from Little Acorns to Year 6. Well done to all the children for their hard work.

Fantastic Results

Our results for EYFS, Phonics, Key Stage 1, Multiplication Checks and Key Stage 2 have been published. I would like to say that as a school community we should be delighted at all of these outcomes and it is testament to our wonderful school team.

EYFS - Good Level of Development 76.9% (County Average 69.1%)

Year 1 Phonics - 62.5% (County Average 72.6%)

Year 2 Reading - 66.7% (County Average 66.1%)

Year 2 Writing - 58.3% (County Average 55.7%)

Year 2 Maths - 75% (County Average 65%)

Year 2 Reading, Writing and Maths combined - 58.3% (County Average 51.2%)

Year 6 Reading - 84% Expected and 42% Greater Depth (Average Scaled Score - 107)

Year 6 Writing - 87% Expected and 42% Greater Depth

Year 6 Maths - 79% Expected and 26% Greater Depth (Average Scaled Score - 105)

Year 6 Grammar - 79% Expected and 42% Greater Depth (Average Scaled Score 107)

Reading, Writing and Maths - 74% Expected, 21% Greater Depth

These are exceptionally strong results, they reflect the strength and talent of the year 6 cohort as well as the consistently strong teaching they have received at Stonegate. The outcome percentages above are in the top 10% of Primary Schools in East Sussex.

Lovely Lollies

A big thank you to Mrs Hazeldine for arranging the ice lollies after school on a Friday. This has raised £186 to purchase resources for the EYFS department.

Changes to the School Day

From September, the school day will be extended by 10 minutes from **8.45am to 3.15pm.** This is to conform to the 2023 Department of Education minimum expectation for the length of a school week. These 10 minutes will be well used to further support phonics and reading.
