Food, Glorious Food

We are having an increasing number of families who are not ordering school meals. We would therefore like to remind you that Payments and bookings MUST be made by 8.30pm the day before the meal using the Parent Pay System. (Meals are free for Reception, Yr 1 and 2 must still be booked).

If you do have any difficulties, we ask you to visit the kitchen to see Mrs Knight when you drop off in the morning as she can directly update dinners. A dinner is not guaranteed if it is not booked and parents may be asked to provide a packed lunch.

We also ask that ALL home packed lunches and ALL break time snacks are healthy and that to keep everyone in the school safe that they DO NOT contain any nuts.

Lateness: Being on Time Matters Too!

Another reminder to all parents that the school day begins at 8.45am. If your child arrives after this, they will be asked to go to the school office to register. This process may lead to parents being asked to come in to discuss the situation if their child is persistently late for school.

If your child is late it can lead to missed learning, an unsettled day and disrupts the learning of all the other children too.

If your child is unwell, please support Miss Keeler by using the school answer machine system **before 8.45am each morning of an absence** – you do not need to call the office if you have left a message.
