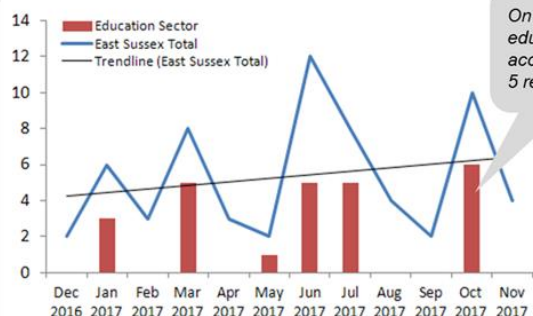

4 in 5 referrals

#### Islamist

- Typically male, aged <32 years old
- 7 in 10 cases referred by police, prison or probation. Just 1 of 17 from schools
- Primarily influenced by online sources, and also by friends and peer groups
- Daesh is the inspiring group in 65% of cases
- Relatively few subjects (4) have mental health well-being issues

#### Right-wing /anti-Islamic

- Male, 4 in 5 aged <25 years old
- 3 in 5 are aged under 18
- Half of cases referred by education sector from all areas except Wealdon
- Influenced by online sources
- Comments consisting of right-wing/Nazi/anti-Muslim/anti-Daesh rhetoric
- 4 cases referred to Channel

"The majority of referrals in East Sussex are male and we have seen a trend with young people with diagnosed/undiagnosed ASD"

Between September 2016 and September 2023 there have been no reported instances of extremism (or other concerns) at Stonegate Primary School.
