Snow Policy

Stonegate CE Primary School and The Little Acorns Pre-School will endeavour to remain open where possible during bad weather conditions.

However, opening the Pre-School will depend on several aspects:

- Firstly how many staff are able to travel to work safely; we will not remain open unless satisfactory staff/child ratios can be maintained.
- Secondly, if the nursery is accessible.
- Thirdly, if the building is at a suitable temperature for the children.

A decision will be made each day by the HeadTeacher as to whether the Pre-School will open and parents will be informed by email or telephone by 08.00am.

If weather conditions worsen throughout the day, we may need to make the decision to close early in order to ensure all children and staff are able to get home safely. If this is the case, we will contact parents as soon as possible to give you time to collect their children.

Winter Policy

In winter we encourage children to bring in coats and welly boots to Pre-School and will use forest school waterproofs, if necessary.

We will arrange our provision to ensure children continue to get access to the outside areas and opportunities for appropriate timings and in appropriate clothing.

Summer Policy

At the start of the Summer Term, we request all children come into Pre-School with a named hat and sun cream. If a parent would prefer to take these items home we request they are bought in on a daily basis.

The staff will apply sun-cream to the children where parent permission has been given.

We will encourage the children to wear hats and drink lots of water.

During extremely hot conditions, we will rearrange the day to play outside earlier in the morning when the weather is cooler and play in the shade.

We request the children have appropriate clothing for all weather at all times.
